 - organizational and study skills,
 - work on critical thinking and asking probing questions,
 - get academic help from peers and college tutors,
 - and participate in enrichment and motivational activities that make college seem attainable.

- You want your transcripts and college applications to show your commitment to learning and ability to succeed in multiple activities



While fewer than seven and a half percent of all California grads attend one of the University of California's nine undergraduate campuses, more than thirteen percent of AVID grads plan to enroll in the country's best public university system.




