Dougherty Valley High School, established in 2007, has quickly become known for its academic excellence. Located in San Ramon, our student body is reflective of the surrounding community and greater San Francisco Bay Area. Situated approximately 35 miles east of San Francisco, San Ramon is a largely suburban community whose residents are primarily business professionals. The DVHS student body mirrors its community's socio-economic and educational diversity. The ethnic/racial make-up of our student population is: 78% Asian, 9% Caucasian, 4% Hispanic/Latino, 3% African American, <1% Native American, <1% Pacific Islander. <1% other races. There are 146 certificated teachers on staff this year. Our total student enrollment is 3,267.

2022 - 2023 Academics

Student life at DVHS is rich with opportunities that include a wide variety of courses as well as access to many co- and extra-curricular activities. Per district policy, students must enroll in a five- or six-period day for all four years of high school. Juniors and seniors have the option of enrolling in a seventh class, if desired. Freshmen and sophomores may enroll in a seventh class, but only if the class is part of an academic program (Academic Enrichment, AVID, ELD, Special Education) or is one of the school's co-curricular programs (Journalism, Leadership, Music, Yearbook). Due to constant growing enrollment, students are limited to taking one math and one science class per year. Students earn 5 credits per course, for each semester course they pass with a D- or higher. Rank in class is **not** computed.

Effective for the class of 2019, SRVUSD has implemented the following to increase students' choice and flexibility in their schedules. For a complete list and description of all PLIs, please visit the [SRVUSD Personalized Learning](http://SRVUSD Personalized Learning website) website:

- Reduction of high school graduation required credits from 240 to 220.
- Ability to place non-district coursework on the SRVUSD transcript to satisfy high school graduation requirements (maximum of 20 credits in any curricular area; maximum of 20 credits/academic year).
- Ability to place non-district elective coursework on the SRVUSD transcript (maximum of 20 credits/academic year).
- Option to take five, six, or seven classes on campus (individual site restrictions may apply).

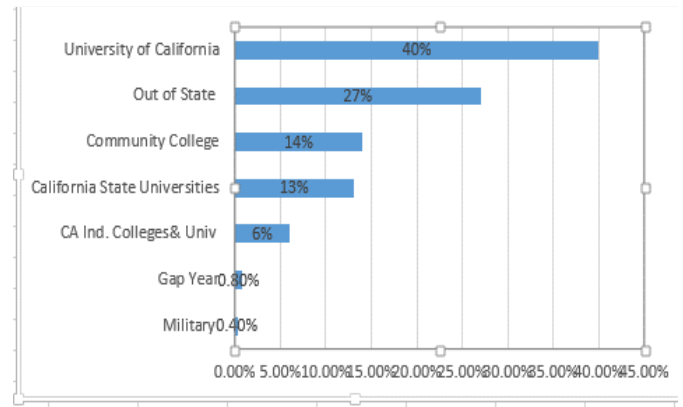
